GWHCC hosts first major in-person event

GWHCC hosted the 2021 Annual Business Expo on September 16, 2021 at the Walter E Convention Center. The event featured over **80 of our region's businesses** exhibiting their services and products. The expo was the first major in-person event for the Chamber since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic in March 2020.

This year's Expo featured a **panel discussion on the new National American Latino Museum**, workshops on Cybersecurity, Doing Business with Pepco, Digital Marketing, and Tourism. Also, the **Small Business Village was back and the Job Pavilion** provided those seeking employment the opportunity to meet with recruiters and potential employers.

The **Executive Luncheon brought together 300** of the region's business leaders, entrepreneurs, and government officials. Latino Businesses Experienced Disproportionate Hardship as a Result of COVID-19, and Benefitted Less from Pandemic Assistance

A new study identifies challenges faced by Latino-owned enterprises in the DC-Metro Area when seeking aid during the crisis, but also local innovations for the future

Researchers and faculty in American University's Center for Latin American and Latino Studies (CLALS), conducted a comprehensive [study](#) documenting COVID-19 relief programs and challenges for businesses in the Washington, DC Metro Area in response to the pandemic crisis. The study details steps taken by local jurisdictions to provide often hard-to-reach Latino small business owners with crucial financial and technical assistance.

The study, [Pandemic Relief for Latino-Owned Businesses: Lessons from the Washington DC Metropolitan Area](#), is authored by [Robert Albro](#), faculty in CLALS and [Eric Hershberg](#), Director of CLALS and faculty in AU's School of Public Affairs, is the most recent outcome of an ongoing center research program

A new study co-sponsored by GWHCC, American University's [Kogod](#) School of Business and AU's Center for Latin American and Latino Studies, identifies challenges faced by Latino-owned enterprises in the DC Metro Area when seeking aid during the crisis, but also local innovations for the future.
